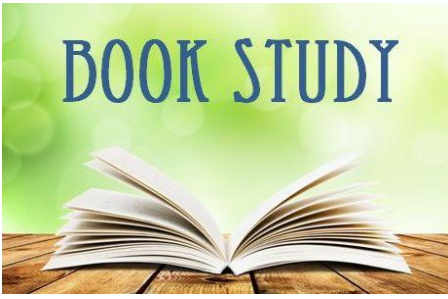

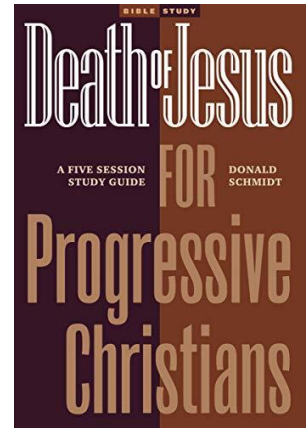
Joint BOOK STUDY GROUP for all 3 Churches & friends: Friday Mornings at 10 AM
